Course Delivery

The course is delivered via our web-based on-line learning facility in conjunction with face-to-face training sessions in the field, a flexible blended learning environment.

The course content focuses on key skills that develop your knowledge for application of these skills and should be contextualised as required to address specific industry, enterprise or workplace requirements and to address specific risks and hazards and associated injuries

The face-to-face training and assessment is conducted in various locations throughout Australia and is based upon demand.
